**Description:** Canoeing takes place on Hautbois' private Cut and the River Bure. Ratios are 1:8 for this activity with an operating area from Hautbois Cut to the Horstead Centre's pontoon.

Hypo/hyperthermia	Participants: not dressed correctly for the conditions. Unplanned capsizes.	Clients to be dressed appropriately for weather conditions. Due to the nature of the client base Kayaking to be suspended October to January except on special circumstances.	2	2	L
Equipment failure	Participants and Instructors - unmaintained canoes; cuts or scrapes from plastic and woodwork. Sinking boat due to cracks within the hull. Buoyancy aid failure due to foam degradation.	Weekly and monthly inspections recorded.  All Canoeing equipment to be correctly stored and checked on a session and periodical basis.	2	2	L
Minor injuries - cuts and bruises	Participants - playing games in the kayaks.	Moving about kayaks games reduced to a minimum, if any raft running games to be played helmets to be worn.	2	2	L

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Operating area	Participants and Instructors - group paddling too far and becoming fatigued. If an incident occurred too far from assistance.	Operating area to be set up between wooden pedestrian bridge to the Cut and Horstead pontoon. All Instructors to have been certified competent. For extended trips a separate Risk Assessment must be completed.	2	2	L
Infection from water/river bank	Instructor and participants- weill's disease (leptospirosis) and similar from contaminated water	Participant and clients briefed on washing hands with warm soapy water and showering after activity, and washing clothing worn.	4	1	L
